## Dual Credit Student FERPA Release to High School Administration

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education.

FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level.

**Due to these FERPA regulations we can only give student information directly to the student. By signing this documentation you will allow the college to release information to the high school administration. Parents may obtain student college records for dual-enrollment through the high school counselor. For dual-enrollment courses instructed by adjunct faculty from the high school staff, parents may be able to obtain information from that secondary school faculty member, depending on the school district's policy.**
