Open every day 9am-7pm. Admission charge is \$5 adults, \$4 military and seniors 60+, \$3 children 12 and under, children under 4 are free.

Except where other programming is scheduled below, the following films will be shown on a daily basis:

The Trans– Alaska Pipeline– A look at how and why the Trans– Alaska Pipeline was built. Daily showings at 11, 1, and 3.

Between the Glacier and the Sea– The Great Alaska Earthquake of 1964 could not destroy the spirit of the people of Valdez, Alaska. Daily showings at 11:30, 1:30, and 3:30.

Prince William Sound- Up Close!- An amazing film about the wildlife and glaciers of Prince William Sound, created by award- winning cinematographer, Bill Rome. Daily showings at 12:05, 2:05, and 4:05.

From 10-11am, every Wednesday when there is a cruise ship in port, Professor Bob Benda, local wildlife expert, will be giving a vibrant and intriguing presentation in the Museum, called The Wildlife of Alaska. Free with museum admission. The dates are: 6/3, 6/17, 7/1, 7/15, 7/29, 8/12, 8/26, and 9/9.

Wednesday, June 3rd– An Afternoon with Award Winning Cinematographer, Bill Rome. Featuring some new films and a discussion with Bill Rome about his film making. Films which will be shown are: *Alaska's Sky, Nature's Canvas; Columbia Glacier; Scholar, the World's Most Intelligent Stellar's Jay; Prince William Sound's Most Wanted* (especially fun for kids); and *Glacier Hazards*, as well as his most popular, *Prince William Sound- Up Close!* Free with museum admission. Noon-5pm.

Wednesday June 17th– Explore the Geology of Alaska, with PWSCC Geologist, Suzanne McCarthy. Free with museum admission. Noon-2pm.

Wednesday, July 1st– Fur Sewing Workshop– Learn to make a beaver fur headband. Cost– \$35.00 per person. Limit of 12 people, first come basis. Noon– 3pm.

Monday, August 3rd– The Culture of Hunting in Alaska– Learn about the practices, ethics, and conservation efforts associated with hunting in Alaska. Free with museum admission. 2– 3pm.

Wednesday, August 12th– *Eating Alaska*– Ellen Frankenstein's serious and humorous film about connecting with where you live and eating locally. Followed by a potluck of Alaskan cuisine. \$20.00 charge per person. Film at 11am, Lunch at Noon. Also, that day will be a How to Smoke Salmon workshop. Details to be Announced.

Wednesday, September 9th- *Alaska in Flight*– a visit from a real live Great Horned Owl and Saw whet Owl. Sponsored by ERA Aviation. \$10 charge per person, includes museum admission. Noon and 5pm.
